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DON'T Make These Ethical Errors:



Wrong observations or analysis



Careless record keeping



Biased/altered study design



Data fabrication, falsification, selection/omission



Misusing (public) funds



Breaking local/national rules



Illegal human/animal experimentation, no ethics approval/consent: follow Declaration of Helsinki

Avoid Errors and Misconduct 1

- Reporting methods incompletely to prevent replication
- Misleading interpretations
- × Ignoring work of others; not checking latest versions
- Overlooking others' use of flawed data; citing retracted material
- Not declaring financial/non-financial conflicts of interest
 - paid/unpaid work, company stock, grants, royalties
 - patents (pending or registered)
 - if you have been an expert witness
 - relationships, affiliations, beliefs
- Publishing in/using fake journals: https://ThinkCheckSubmit.org

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Avoid Errors and Misconduct 2

- Don't ignore/misquote previous work of others
- Cite sources, obtain © permission if needed, reference carefully
- Acknowledge people who helped (technical, statistical, art, editorial), with permission
- Acknowledge funders and donors of materials (and their role in research/reporting)
- For presentations/publications: check authorship

Avoid Errors and Misconduct 3

- Ethics policy statements of target journal or your university
- ✓ Equator Network guidelines for specific study types
- ✓ Good Publication Practice 3 (GPP3) guidelines for industry-sponsored medical research
- ✓ International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) guidelines
- ✓ Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE) guidelines


Present (and Share) Your Data Ethically



Check Your Data Presentation Before Submitting

Table (especially with multiple subgroups/ Specific numbers variables); check if SI (Système International) units Time trends, Line graph, scatter plot; check the axes are labelled well relationships Bar graph/chart, histogram (parametric); box plot (non-parametric) Pie chart, stacked bar chart; check %s total 100 and total N is given 100% Flow chart, flow diagram, schematic for chemical Process, function reactions; check all text is readable Photograph, drawing, exploded-view diagram, map; Appearance, check if you need to indicate scale location

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Try to keep ©, target Open Access journals



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Publish only if you have copyright permission & reference:

- Preprints, working papers, discussion papers
- Blogs, reports
- Conference proceedings of short papers + extra data
- Translations
- Extract/summary
- Regional publications, specialty publication (different aspect)





What The Journal Will Check For in Your Submitted Paper

The research:

- ✓ Relevant hypothesis/research Q
- √ Good experimental design
- ✓ Ethically done and reported
- √ Appropriate methodology
- √ Good data analysis
- √ Valid conclusions

The manuscript:

- ✓ Logical flow of information
- ✓ Manuscript structure and formatting
- ✓ Appropriate references
- ✓ High readability



What The Journal Will Check For in Your Submitted Paper, Part 2

Trial ethics	Has a prospective human trial been registered?
Report ethics	Has the protocol changed? Was the hypothesis written in advance? Is there report redundancy or overlap? Is there a data sharing statement?
Approval	Has ethics approval been given?
Consent	Have participants given consent?
Misconduct	Is there evidence of fabrication, falsification, or plagiarism?
Declarations	Are there acknowledgments, declarations of funding, conflicts of interest?

'Blinded' or 'masked' review should remain confidential

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
Recommending Peer Reviewers For Your Paper



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Be Careful Who You Recommend As a Peer Reviewer!





Has Someone Recommended You to Peer Review Their Paper?

Only peer review if you are an expert in the area
Only peer review if you can meet the deadline
Do not use or share any author material
Do not get someone else to review
Do not contact the authors; do not add your name as author; do not force authors to cite anything
State any financial/personal relationships that could bias the work; recuse yourself if needed






